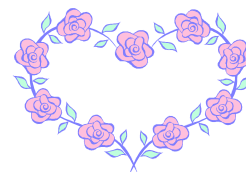

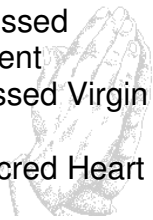

### CHAPEL BOOK REVIEW



#### POEMS FOR MEDITATION

I often bring a book of poems with me to the John Paul II Eucharistic Adoration Chapel--religious poems that serve to trigger meditation and conversation with God. I like to think that God himself is in a profound way a poet. He certainly reveals himself to us in an often poetic way. Religious poets throughout the Judeo-Christian history have shared their poetic visions with us and the amazing thing about poetry is that we can share in the poetic vision as we read, internalize the poem by relating it to our own experience, and thereby in a very personal way we finish the poem.

Dr. Regis Martin, Professor of Theology at Franciscan University at Steubenville Ohio, spoke about just such experience as

he talked on EWTN Catholic television about his book *Images of Grace: 33 Christian Poems*.

He recommended that it would be a great companion to those praying in a Perpetual Adoration Chapel. The book has some famous Christian poems like John Donne's "A Hymn to God the Father," and some lesser known poems. My favorite is John Henry Cardinal Newman's poem "The Pillar of the Cloud" which begins:

Lead, kindly Light, through the encircling gloom;

Lead Thou me on!

You will find Dr. Martin's book of poems in the library of the Adoration Chapel. It is a small book about the size of your hand with a mostly green cover.



### Notes from the Adoration team

As we approach our 2<sup>nd</sup> anniversary (April) of perpetual adoration at St. Elizabeth Seton parish, we begin to reflect on the blessing that our chapel is to our parish and to each parishioner. There are 24 hourly coordinators for the adorers during a specific hour of the day. Other opportunities to assist include: Martha Ministry (weekly cleaning), librarian, Sign Up Sunday committee, updating our substitute list, etc. More about ways to help, next month... #### IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR ALL ADORERS & VISITORS

*Here are a few gentle reminders to help us all to be considerate of our fellow adorers and parish staff members who share use of the building where the chapel is located:*

- be sure all doors are latched tightly when you enter; DO NOT leave door ajar for next adorer
- the back parish office door is for restroom access only; use front door for parish business
- parish office is closed for business from noon to 1 pm daily
- if you are obtaining a sub during evening/early morning hours, be sure to give the sub the security code so they can get in
- park away from the area directly in front of the chapel, which is reserved for parish office visitors during regular business hours
