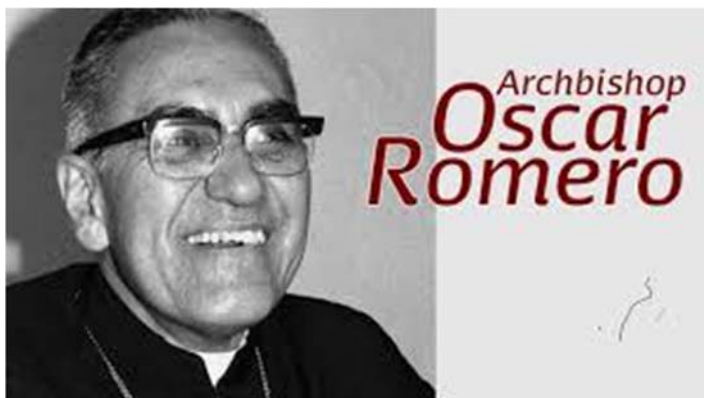

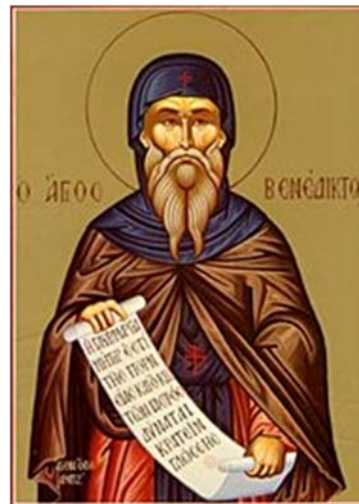

**Our used book sale is scheduled for the weekend of January 18, 19, and 20. Please save your books for resale at \$.50 - \$1.00.**

Remember to monitor the temperature in your home. Adjust your thermostat – lower in the winter. We can always put on an extra sweater or jacket. Clean or replace filters as recommended.

Caulk and weather strip around doors and windows to plug air leaks. Winterize your home now.

Our ministry has a recycling cart in the lower level next to the stairs. There are a number of items we can recycle for you. Just put them on that cart and we will take care of them. PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE TVS THERE since we have no resources to dispose of them.

But we will recycle LP records, like new office supplies, writing utensils, art and craft supplies and yarn. There is a container for new and broken crayons, as well as pop tops and plastic bread tags. We will recycle keys, buttons, Brita water filters, eye glasses and sunglasses, hearing aids, corks (natural cork only, no plastic) and cords (phone, computer), phones, ink cartridges, digital cameras and calculators.

Please remember to use cloth bags when shopping, and refuse the plastic bags since there is simply too much plastic trash on our earth.

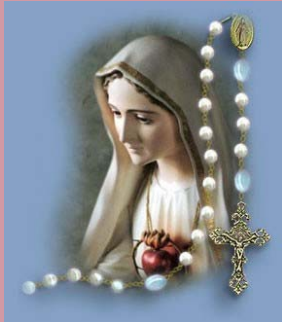

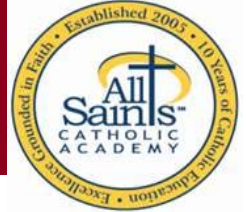

## **Fourth Grade is Fantastic!**

The **fourth grade students at All Saints Catholic Academy** are settling in nicely to the 2018-2019 school year, and continue to grow both spiritually and academically.

In **Religion**, we are learning the Ten Commandments and how they are a gift from God. We continue to deepen our reading comprehension through fiction and non-fiction texts, with lessons that focus on story sequencing, identifying problem and solution, and finding the main idea and details in our **Language Arts classes**. In **Math**, we are reviewing multi-digit addition and subtraction, and interpreting data by creating line plots and bar graphs.
