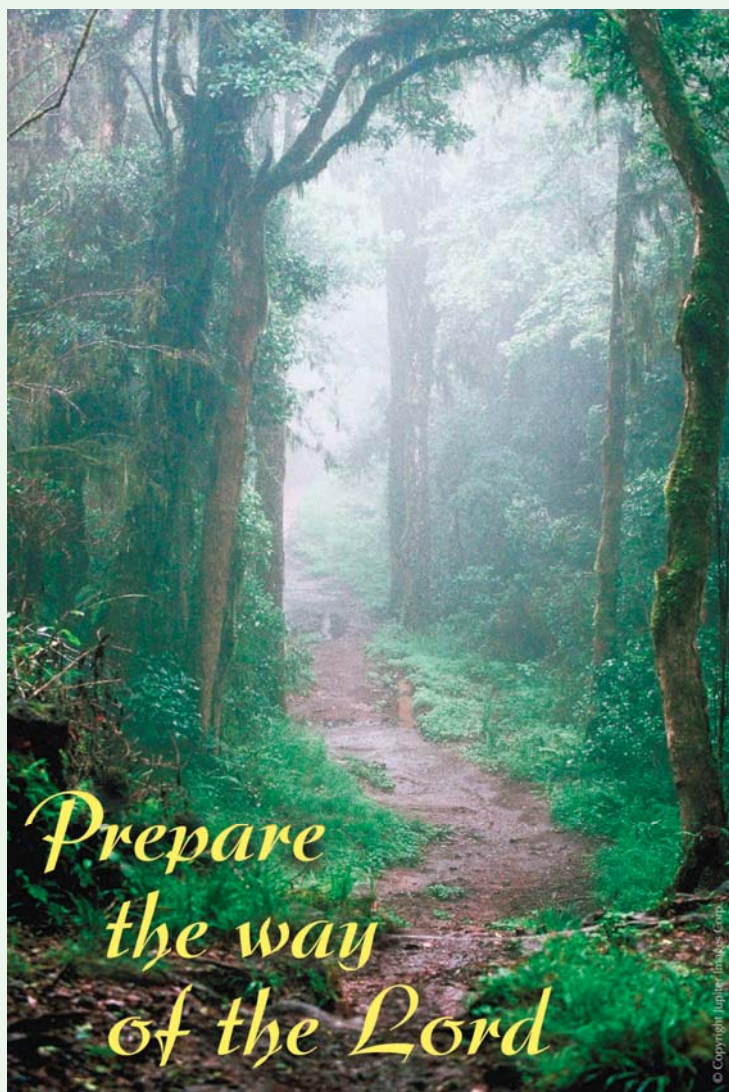

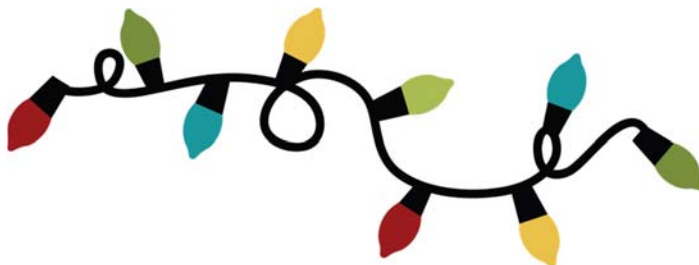

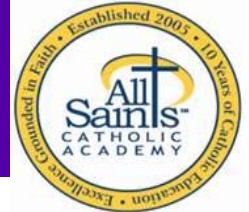

SICK AND HOMEBOUND: Contact the Parish Office if you would like Communion, or if we can help you in any way.

PRAYER REQUESTS: When a family member is sick, having surgery, etc., you may call the Parish Office to put them on the petitions for the weekend. We will keep them on for 2 weeks. If you wish for them to remain on the petitions you must call every 2 weeks.

HOSPITAL VISITS: When you are in the hospital and want someone from St. Elizabeth Seton to visit you, please let us know by calling the Parish Office. Due to privacy policies, we will not be notified by the hospital if you have been admitted - it is the responsibility of the patient or family to notify the parish.

LOW GLUTEN HOSTS: Those in need of receiving low-gluten hosts at Communion are invited to meet the Deacon of the Mass at the credence table located behind the right side of the reredos (wooden structure behind the altar) toward the end of the distribution of Communion.

REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE: Anyone with reason to believe that a child has been abused or is being abused should report their suspicions to civil authorities. Contact: Illinois Department of Children and Family Services: 1-800-25ABUSE (1-800-252-2873) or local police. The Diocese of Joliet Victim Assistance Coordinator is available to help victims/survivors of child sexual abuse by a cleric, employee or volunteer of the Catholic Church. The Victim Assistance Coordinator will report to Bishop Conlon and coordinate efforts of pastoral support and outreach to assist in the healing process.
